Get Ready

I hope that all of you had the opportunity to listen to our January sermon series entitled "Gather In" where we focused on the importance of being a part of the body of Christ. I've been very excited to see many of you respond with positive comments and a renewed commitment to participate in what God is doing here at FBC. Well, I'm even more excited as we enter February and I get to move on to our next sermon series called "Get Ready."

Over the next few Sundays I will build upon what we've already learned and spend time talking about how a committed, church-going Christian, needs to also be a consistently spiritually growing Christian. Our theme verse for the month comes from Philippians 3:12 where Paul writes, "Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me." (NIV) There's so much going on in this verse, way more than I can share in this brief article, (we'll get a chance to dive deeper starting on February 7!) but I want to quickly draw your attention to the first part of this verse. To me, two things stand out. First, Paul had a goal, and second, he knew there was always work left to be done to reach that goal.

His goal was spiritual growth. He wanted to become more like Jesus, to be continually drawing closer to God and growing in his walk with Christ. I'd say that's a pretty praiseworthy goal. I'd also say that's the same goal that every born again believer should have. While having a goal is important, it's the second point I mentioned that really deserves our attention. Just as Paul knew the work of reaching his goal would never end, so too must we realize that our journey of spiritual growth is forever ongoing. We should never become complacent or satisfied with our current spiritual condition. There's always room for growth!

The reason this next series will be called "Get Ready" is because I want us all to understand that we are continually being called to get ready for what God has in store for us next. And I believe God is trying to prepare us for some pretty awesome things! I hope you will join me this month as we learn what it means to "Get Ready!"

Caring for Our Church Family: Meals of Love

At our January business meeting, we opened the floor to hear your comments and feedback about our church's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The conversation quickly turned from speaking about blocking off pews, cleaning, and requiring masks to a burden on everyone's heart for our church members and friends shut in their homes for safety reasons.

We all pray that one day we will all be together again in-person, but we recognize that for those staying home, that desire to be with your church family and connect with others is even more painful and lonely at times. At the business meeting, we tried to come up with some better, new, and creative ideas for reaching out to those at home, and we challenged those present to continue praying and thinking of ideas when we adjourned as well.



One of the creative ideas that God placed on our pastor's hearts became Meals of Love. On Saturday, February 20 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. our pastors are going to be delivering a hot meal to any of our church members that would like to receive one and a visit. They will bring it to your front door, catch up with you for a little bit, and pray with you. On top of that, they even plan to cook the meals themselves for you: roast, mashed potatoes, green beans, rolls, and dessert.

Any church member that is interested in receiving a meal can sign up on the bulletin board outside the office or by calling the church office at (573) 756-4654. Whenever you sign up, please also include how many meals you need for the members of your household. In order to cook enough meals, however, there will be a deadline to sign up by February 14.

If there are a lot of signups for Meals of Love, there will also be backup date of March 6, that the pastors will cook again and deliver to those they cannot get to on February 20.

You can help us too by praying for our pastors as they visit with our church members at home. Pray that not only will each person receive physical nourishment, but also spiritual nourishment and comfort that God is with them even when they are apart from us and that they are on our hearts. Pray that soon we will all be able to meet together again in person and continue on in fellowship and worship with one another. Pray too that God will continue to guide our staff in how best to lead our church through this crisis and how to stay connected to those who cannot be with us right now. And, ask God how he might use you to reach out to your church family that is at home feeling isolated. We are thankful for God's promises in the midst of the pandemic. "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." Isaiah 41:10



Dinosaurs, the Ark, and Students? Oh My!

This spring our students, Grades 5-12, have a unique opportunity to learn about the creation and the story of Noah's Ark. From March 31 through April 3, pastors Jason and Mark will be leading a group of pre-teens and teens to the Creation Museum and the Ark Encounter in Petersburg and Williamsburg, Kentucky.

The Creation Museum allows families to experience earth history as God has revealed it in the Bible. Nearly 150 exhibits feature fearsome animatronic dinosaurs, talking heroes of the faith, and professional displays that honor God's Word. The museum also boasts a fun-filled, 200-seat special effects theater, a state-of-the-art planetarium, a petting zoo, nature trails, and lots more. At the heart of the Creation Museum is a chronological retelling of biblical history in seven parts called the Seven C's, beginning with Creation, and fast-forward to Christ's return. Along the way, they see how God's Word provides the big-picture answers for our most difficult questions, whether about science, the Bible, or our personal relationship with God.

Ark Encounter features a full-size Noah's Ark, built according to the dimensions given in the Bible. Spanning 510 feet long, 85 feet wide, and 51 feet high, this modern engineering marvel amazes visitors



The deadline to sign up to go and pay the deposit fee of \$25 is January 31, however if you miss the deadline and want to go, come talk to one of the pastors. Thanks to generous donations the cost of \$200 per student to go has dropped significantly, but if you are still interested in providing a scholarship for students in need of financial assistance to go, please contact the church office.

New Lighthouse Harbor


Pastor Mark is excited to restart Lighthouse Harbor, our Sunday morning children's worship service, this February! Lighthouse Harbor does not meet on the first Sunday of each month, so the first date back will be February 14 at 10:30 a.m., but there will be some exciting new changes beginning as well.

Previously, children could be dropped off at Lighthouse Harbor prior to the 10:30 a.m. service and spend the entire service there. Now, children will be asked to join their parents each Sunday in the sanctuary for the first half of the worship service. During the service, any children, PreK-Grade 6, wanting to go will be directed to get up and leave together with Pastor Mark and his volunteers to finish the remainder of the service in Lighthouse Harbor. Parents will then pick up their children at Lighthouse Harbor after the service as usual.

Also, the last Sunday of each month, Lighthouse Harbor will now be Missions Sunday where the children will learn about missionaries and why we do missions.
