As some of you may know, about a year ago we adopted two cats. It was NOT my idea. I think I've made it quite clear that I'm a dog person, for it's a well known fact that all dogs go to Heaven. As for cats, well...

I had agreed to getting the cats under one condition, which is that I wouldn't be responsible for taking care of them. I help out quite a lot around the house but I'm also extremely busy with other tasks so I didn't want to add to my list feeding more animals and changing a litter box. To their credit, my boys have done the lion's share of the work. With Penny's help, they feed the animals twice a day and deal with all the mess. I've been very proud of them. However, the night before they left on their trip, I was reminded that I was to dutifully care for ALL the animals and was given clear instructions on the cleaning and feeding protocols.
