The Blessing of Saying "Yes!" to God

Recently, one of our Sunday School teachers shared with me a very encouraging interaction she had with a member of her class. As most of you know, I've spent a large portion of this year preaching on the importance of going out with the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. The other pastors and I have shared with you our vision of eighty percent participation in mission within the next 2 years. I've repeatedly tried to hammer home the need for ALL of us to get to doing this important work of the Lord. That's why it brought me such joy when this particular Sunday School teacher shared with her class about an upcoming missions opportunity and another lady spoke up saying, "Sign me up! That's exactly what Pastor Greg has been telling us to do!"

I promise that it's not vanity that makes this story so meaningful to me. I don't need the credit or recognition, but it does feel good to know that people are listening and responding to the things God has been laying on my heart. God gets all the glory in this! I am so blessed by stories like this because I know that one of the signs of a healthy church is when people are regularly responding to God's Word.

In his book, Autopsy of a Deceased Church, author Thom Rainer tells a sad story that illustrates the dangers that come from having an unmovable heart and a spirit of unwillingness. Let me share his words:

Do you know the name Harry Truman? Let me be clearer. Do you know the name Harry Randall Truman? No, we was not a former president. He was a homeowner at the foot of Mount St. Helens in Washington state. In 1980, the volcanic mountain was showing signs of a major eruption. Truman's home was located...in the most likely path of the volcanic flow. He was facing almost certain death. Government officials implored him to leave. Friends told him that his failure to move was tantamount to suicide. Family members begged him to leave lest he die. On May 18, 1980, the massive eruption took place. The lava flowed right in the projected path of Truman's home. On May 18, 1980, Harry Randall Truman died.

Often times, God uses His Word as a warning call for our lives. Whether it's through the preacher's sermon, the Sunday School teacher's lesson, or just in a moment of quiet devotion, the Holy Spirit will take the inspired Word of God and convict our hearts. But what happens when our spirit becomes unwilling to respond to the Spirit of God? Trust me, you don't want to find out the answer to that question. *(continued on next page)*
