Since that, we did this event to benefit our youth and children's ministries, Pastor Mark and Pastor Jason had asked their students to come and serve as volunteers, which many of them did. Two of those young volunteers were my boys, Peyton and Parker. I was quite proud of them in spite of a couple of reminders to keep them focused on the tasks at hand, they served with enthusiasm and without complaint.

At one point of that Saturday afternoon, my oldest son, Peyton, took a turn at helping with the car wash. His job was to stand on the street corner with a sign enticing passing drivers to pull in and shine up their rides. Peyton went about this task with his own unique flair. Instead of just waiving his sign with a smile on his face, he decided to yell as loud as he could at everyone who passed by inviting them in. I don't mind that he called out to passing motorists, but it was what he was yelling that I found rather humorous. Every time a car came by Peyton held his sign up high and then shouted with loud voice, "Free car wash! We do a decent job!" Considering that the car wash was being done by a small group of kids and young teenagers who hadn't washed all that many cars before, I would call that truth in advertising!

I think this story really resonates with me for I get bothered when preachers and other Bible teachers gloss over the true cost of following Jesus. They talk about the joy of heaven and the blessings of peace and fulfillment, all of which are true, but somehow the call to obedience and self-denial gets left out because people don't liker hearing about such things. Where's the truth in that?


If you have been to church, I am sure you have seen the signs of VBS everywhere. We are still wanting volunteers, even if you can only
