Believing by Faith in the Resurrection

This coming Sunday, we get to join together and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. However, I'm fully aware that there are many who would consider the story of a dead, yet now alive, Savior as mythology or a fairy-tale and the faith that millions have placed in such a belief to be foolishness. Sometimes I stop and wonder what would happen for those who have rejected Jesus Christ, if they took the time to truly examine the evidence.

In his best-selling book, *The Case for Christ*, author and former atheist Lee Strobel sought to debunk the major claims of the Christian faith. Strobel sat down with several of Christianity's leading theologians and grilled them on how they actually came to believe, what was in his opinion, utter nonsense. The final result of his interviews was that Strobel came to realize that these men and women had great justification for their faith, so much so that he too placed his faith in Jesus.

While I would highly recommend that you take time to read *The Case for Christ* for yourself, I thought I would quickly share and summarize just two or three of many, many evidences given by those interviewed as to why they firmly believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

- Jesus' disciples were willing to die for their belief that He has risen. As I once heard it said, "Liars make terrible martyrs." It would be one thing for me to give my life for something I deeply believed in, but the disciples would willingly be tortured and put to death for something they claimed to have personally seen. If the resurrection was just some made up story, do you think Jesus' first followers would have shown that kind of commitment to what they knew was a lie?
- Women were the first to see and testify about the resurrection. This may not seem like a big deal today, but 2,000 years ago, if you were going to make up a story that you wanted others to accept, you would NEVER have women as the primary eye-witnesses. In that day and time, women were not allowed to provide testimony in a court and their word was not viewed as reliable. Thankfully, things are different today, but the fact that women were the first to see the risen Savior and that their account was used in Scripture, lends a huge amount of credibility to the record.
- Skeptics like Paul and James (Jesus' half-brother) were converted. From a worldly perspective, people like Paul and James had nothing to gain and everything to lose by becoming followers of Jesus. Of course, the reality was that they had everything to gain, but most didn't see it that way. Again, with access to the first-hand information available, why would someone dedicate his or her whole life to what they knew wasn't true? The only answer is that those one-time skeptics were convinced, beyond a shadow of a doubt, that Jesus was alive.

I could go on to list many more defenses of the resurrection, just as Strobel's book does, but in the end it doesn't really matter. Why? Because the issue of being a follower of Jesus, believing in His death, burial, and resurrection, is something that will always come down to faith. You must choose to believe. You have the freedom to choose to believe that it's all made up; just something that people tell each other to help them sleep better at night. Or, you can choose, BY FAITH, to believe that Jesus truly was and is the Son of God, that He died on the cross for your sins, and that He rose from the tomb on the third day.

For the many of you who have already made that wonderful decision to believe by faith, then let's rejoice together as we celebrate how our lives have been made new in our Savior. However, don't forget to share that message of Good News with those who have yet to believe.

"For we live by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5:7, NIV)

Churches That Embrace Children

We all know of restaurants that embrace children as part of their business model. McDonalds and Burger King come to mind. CiCi's pizza is another. These restaurants understand the value of children and spend millions to ensure their business welcomes kids and parents.

Families visiting our church will know whether we embrace their kids or not. What are some key concepts for churches that want to demonstrate embracing children as part of their ministry?

- Messy is healthy. Children learning to take in God's Word, learning to worship, and to love Jesus are just as messy as a kids in a restaurant. There is line of dirt on walls about two feet high because little hands are dragging as kids walk the halls. Messy is healthy.
- Value noise over perfection. Children make noises in worship and in classes. Children cry, scream and yell. Whenever we hear a baby crying in church don't get angry because of the noise. Instead get angry at the person who is angry with the child.
- Protect children at all costs. Child security is a discipleship issue. We are responsible for providing a safe and healthy environment for children.
- Promote children's ministry in multiple venues. Check a church's worship guide, social media, and newsletter. What is in there about children?
- Invest in KidMin. Does a churches budget reflect children as a priority? Does the condition of our children's facilities reflect value for kids?
- Develop understanding of your church at the level of the child. Churches should seek out the perspective of parents, and yes even the kids themselves.

In Luke 18, Jesus *invited* the children. In Mark 10, Jesus embraced the children. Churches that welcome and embrace children are like Jesus. In fact, Jesus becomes angry at the disciples for discounting the value of children. We must be the church that embraces children, not just tolerates them.
